## **Community Partner Spotlight: Coastal Community Bank**

"**Coastal Community Bank** has always been believed that business should give back to communities it serves," says **Curt Queyrouze**, President at Coastal Community Bank (CCB). "We believe that being a good neighbor and giving back is critical to success." The Everett-based bank, founded in 1997, has 14 branches serving Snohomish, Island, and King Counties. While their *community bank* offers traditional full-service banking services for individuals and businesses, their *service division* provides banking in-frastructure, compliance oversight, and FDIC coverage for clients.

CCB has worked with the Interfaith Family Shelter for more than 11 years. "Our bankers and lenders have supported this valued relationship over time," shares Queyrouze, "including providing PPP (paycheck protection program) loans during the pandemic.

We appreciate the services that Interfaith provides and want to support it in any way we can."



In recent years, CCB has also supported important fundraising needs, such as the 2023 Capital Campaign to purchase the Family Shelter and the Annual Fund campaign. "We are a local bank," says Queyrouze. "Our employees work and live here.

We see firsthand that there are not enough resources or housing options to tackle homelessness, especially for families with children." CCB supports financial stability through Access Checking Accounts: affordable and functional accounts to begin building a family's banking foundation. CCB also hosts a free online self-guided financial education platform that teach users budgeting and saving skills.

Interfaith's mission is personal for Queyrouze. "My own family was formed through foster care after our children experienced homelessness," he shares. "There are many ways families end up in need. We can all find ways to ensure that every child has an equal chance at a safe and stable childhood."

#### **Client Perspective: Junice & Lewis**

When they left Georgia for Washington in search of a better life for their family, Junice and Lewis had no idea that their plans to stay with family would fall through. Soon the family of four—with a baby on the way—found themselves living out of their van. Determined to succeed, both parents found jobs. But when their van unexpectedly broke down, the family reached out to Interfaith for shelter and a way out.

"Staff encouraged us to take a breather and adjust," Junice says, remembering early days at Interfaith. Both parents are hard workers. They traded work shifts and saved up, eventually getting another car.

"Interfaith staff were really there to help, they pointed us in the right direction," says Lewis. The family is now housed, while Junice is on paid family leave and they enjoy time with their new baby. "Interfaith helped us get off the streets and find housing. Thank you so much!" says Junice.

#### Volunteer of the Year: Kathy Pemberton

**Kathy Pemberton** has volunteered at Interfaith since 2018. A retired teacher, she wanted to do

her part to help with family homelessness.

"I still enjoy working with the kids," she shares, "and working with Lynn is an absolute joy!" Besides the Children's Program, Kathy also frequently



lends a hand in the community garden at the Family Shelter. "I enjoy gardening and love being able to work there," she adds.

She hopes to continue supporting Interfaith into the future. "Interfaith is very well run and helps so many people in need. I pray it continues to get the support it needs," she says. Thank you, Kathy!
